KAWS

Internationally recognized artist KAWS' newest installation, KAWS:HOLIDAY will be on display in Hong Kong's Victoria Harbour from March 22-31, where it can be viewed from the Central and Western District Promenades. The giant inflatable art piece is the largest reclined sculptural endeavor by the artist to date and features a 121-foot long COMPANION, the signature character of the artist. Highly sought-after by collectors inside and outside of the art world, KAWS' artworks, with their broad appeal, establish him as a uniquely prominent artist in today's culture.




Hotel Alexandra
