Hong Kong Tramways launches the TramOramic Tour Offering visitors and locals a fascinating encounter with the city Aboard a unique 1920s' style heritage tram

(15th January 2016, Hong Kong) Hong Kong Tramways ("Tramways") held a ceremony at Whitty Street Depot today, celebrating the launch of the TramOramic Tour – Hong Kong's first-ever sightseeing tram tour abroad a 1920s' style heritage tram. The ceremony, attended by more than 100 guests, marked a major new Hong Kong tourism initiative and a significant milestone for the city's iconic tramways.

The ceremony today showcased Tramways' commitment to advancing and enhancing its service where the Honourable Mr. Gregory SO Kam-leung, Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development, Dr. Peter LAM Kin-ngok, Chairman of the Hong Kong Tourism Board, Mr. Eric BERTI, Consul General of France in Hong Kong and Macau, Mrs. Ingrid YEUNG HO Poi-yan, Commissioner for Transport, Ms. Cathy CHU Man-ling, Commissioner for Tourism and Mr. Emmanuel VIVANT, Managing Director of Hong Kong Tramways simultaneously made their appearance on stage to officiate ribbon-cutting for unveiling the TramOramic Tour.

The highlight of the TramOramic Package is an amazing 1-hour trip aboard a unique and elegant 1920s' style tram with an open top upper deck. As the journey passes through the city streets, authentic Hong Kong stories and sites of interest are narrated to passengers via personal headphones in eight languages. The tram features an on-board video comparing past and present Hong Kong and a heritage corner with old pictures and genuine tram souvenirs.

The package also includes a 2-day pass giving unlimited free access to the Tramways' regular service to deepen Hong Kong's exploration and seven thematic journey maps for self-guided tours to interesting sites along the tram lines.

The first TramOramic Tour will commence on **24th January 2016**. Tickets are now available for online booking via <u>www.hktramways.com</u> and onboard of each departing tour if seats are still available.

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

Hong Kong Tramways has provided reliable, accessible and affordable commuter services to the city for over 110 years and is the only tramway in the world exclusively operating double-decker trams. About the TramOramic Tour

Resurrected at Hong Kong Tramways tram depot at Whitty Street, the distinctive TramOramic Tram #68 features a unique **1920's style tramcar** with an open top upper deck and a vintage cabin lower deck. The tram has a capacity for **36 passengers** plus a tram captain and a tram attendant dressed in costume. The TramOramic Tram #68 features free WiFi, **on-board videos** and a **picture gallery** comparing past and present Hong Kong as well as a **heritage corner** with genuine tram souvenirs.

True Hong Kong stories and sites of interest were developed with the help of expert city guides, a Hong Kong historian and local tram enthusiasts. Authentic tales of local life and tram history are delivered through personal headsets in the passenger's choice of Cantonese, Mandarin, English, Korean, Japanese, Spanish, French or Russian.

TramOramic Tour Privileges

The package includes a commemorative TramOramic Golden Ticket, which entitles the bearer to the **1-hour TramOramic Tour** and also offers him a **2-day pass giving unlimited free access to the Tramways' regular service** to deepen Hong Kong's exploration and seven thematic journey maps (available on the website) for self-guided tours to interesting sites along the tram lines.

TramOramic Tour Fare

The TramOramic Package aims at offering visitors a unique sightseeing experience of our vibrant city. The fare is HK\$95 per adult, HK\$65 per kid from 4 to 11 years old, free under 4 and HK\$65 per Senior Hong Kong citizen. Tickets are available online via www.hktramways.com and onboard of each departing tour if seats are still available.

Timetable & routes

The TramOramic Tour departs 6 times a day, 365 days per year, travelling along the

busiest Hong Kong spots, *between Western Market Terminus (Sheung Wan) and Causeway Bay Terminus*, and swinging through the Happy Valley loop.
