ESSENTIAL HONG KONG

Whether cruise passengers are getting to know Hong Kong for the first time, or falling in love with it for the umpteenth, these tours of iconic neighbourhoods, spectacular cityscapes, the beautiful harbour and more, deliver the 'wow' factor that is an essential part of every visit.



■ HONG KONG SIGNATURE

From the breathtaking views of the harbour from The Peak Tower to a picturesque market village; and from the fun world of Madame Tussauds to a laid back fishing community: hop on trams, ferries, sampans and more to explore Hong Kong's different worlds and feel like you have travelled thousands of miles.

■ VICTORIA HARBOUR 360 ●

Look down on it from the dizzying heights of the towering sky100 Hong Kong Observation Deck. Take in its amazing skyline from the Tsim Sha Tsui Promenade. Cross its hectic waters to Hong Kong Island on a Chinese junk and see it up close. Experience Victoria Harbour - the pulsating heart of Asia's world city – from a variety of perspectives!

■ DISCOVER THE 'LAND BETWEEN'

The mostly rural New Territories stretch from the high rises of Kowloon to Hong Kong's boundary with Mainland China, where the Shenzhen skyline looms. Discover the diversity of this 'land between' in a temple to three Eastern religions; a Hakka walled village, complete with gun turrets and an ancestral hall that is still in use; and the scenic serenity of a bird sanctuary.









■ HARBOUR CRUISES



See Hong Kong at its most characteristic – see it from the harbour. From a skyscraper forest to quaint waterside communities, and colossal infrastructure to natural beauty, watch Hong Kong as it meets the day, in the golden sunset of afternoon, or at night when it erupts into A Symphony of Lights.

■ STARRY, STARRY NIGHT!



Hong Kong at night is a masterpiece of light. Dive under the neon glow in a teeming street market; swish through it on an open-top bus tour of the city's most iconic thoroughfare; and marvel at its grandest manifestation — the Hong Kong Island skyline from the Kowloon side of the harbour.

From its ancient Chinese past to its cosmopolitan present, Hong Kong has amassed a rich and diverse culture and heritage that can be seen on the streets of the city and in the lifestyles of its people. These tours take you into the soul of Asia's world city.







■ KOWLOON: BEHIND THE SCENES

Overwhelmed by teeming Kowloon? Get off the beaten track and under the skin of this historic district. Silky milk tea flavours, aromatic food markets, mystical stones, traditional wedding gowns and a temple to the Goddess of the Sea — this is Kowloon, behind the scenes.

UNDERSTANDING FENG SHUI

In Hong Kong, practitioners of the ancient Chinese art of *feng shui* are consulted on everything from home purchases and office floor-plans to enormous architectural and engineering projects. Meet a *feng shui* expert to learn more about this mystic practice and discover how it has literally shaped Asia's world city.



ANCIENT HONG KONG

Hong Kong was once a remote corner of the Chinese empire, dominated by powerful clans and wealthy mandarins. Head to the New Territories, where the opulent mansion of an Imperial scholar, the lavishly decorated ancestral hall of the Tang clan, the fortified villages of rural communities, and a temple dedicated to the God of Literature and God of War bring this lost world back to life before your eyes.

■ COLONIAL HERITAGE ()

In 1841, when a flag was planted in Possession Point, Hong Kong's fate took a dramatic turn. Take a walk around the cathedrals, courts and residences of colonial Hong Kong to see the vestiges of an era in which a world city was born and given a distinctive East-meets-West personality.

■ HORSE RACING ●

Thousands of fans waving betting slips; the thunder of hooves as horses gallop by; the roar of the crowd at another close finish! Sometimes it seems that all the energy of Hong Kong is channelled into its race nights. Feel this exceptional passion from The Hong Kong Jockey Club Member's Enclosure!

■ CULTURE ON ARRIVAL ●

You don't have to venture far from the Kai Tak Cruise Terminal to be immersed in Hong Kong's culture and heritage. Within easy reach of your ship you can walk the grounds of Chi Lin Nunnery, a temple complex of elegant Tang dynasty (AD 618-907) style architecture; admire the meticulously landscaped Nan Lian Garden; visit Wong Tai Sin, a temple dedicated to a deified 4th century monk; and still have time to enjoy Kowloon City, a neighbourhood popular for its family-run eateries.





BEST PLACE. BEST TASTE.

In a city of sizzling woks, tinkling wine glasses, boisterous celebrations, cosy eateries, pungent cooking aromas and celebrated culinary festivals, everywhere you turn there is the temptation to dig in and indulge. ■ FRESH FROM THE SEA ● ¶

It's fried, baked, steamed, grilled, sliced, diced and stuffed. More to the point, Hong Kong's seafood is very fresh. So fresh, you can see it swimming minutes before it's on your table. Indulge in a seafood feast on one of Hong Kong's outlying islands, on a floating restaurant or in a fishing village eatery!



■ EAT LIKE A LOCAL 🅒 🝴

From tiny noodle joints to Michelin-starred restaurants, and street-stall snacks to gourmet fare, Hong Kong's local eats will take you off the beaten path and into the heart of the city, revealing the history, culture and lifestyle of Asia's world city, one bite at a time.

Discover how to eat like a local, after learning how to cook like one! Indulge in the city's favourite dining experience — dim sum — in an award-winning restaurant; shop for ingredients in a bustling food market with a celebrity chef; prepare your own Chinese meal; and learn how to pair it with wine.




THEME PARKS

■ Hong Kong Disneyland ●



During the day, enter the magical kingdom inspired by fairy-tale dreams and explore seven themed lands. In each land, enjoy high-quality rides, meet your favourite Disney characters, and watch amazing Broadway-style shows. At night, the spectacular 'Disney Paint the Night' parade is featuring your beloved Disney friends for the first time ever. See the magic for yourself!

On Hong Kong's largest outlying island, scenic countryside, lush green valleys, the spectacular Ngong Ping 360 cable car, serene giant outdoor Buddha statue, picturesque Buddhist monastery, ancient fishing village and beautiful beaches will bring solace to your soul and senses.

■ CHEUNG CHAU ISLAND



Small it may be, but the island of Cheung Chau packs a powerful punch when it comes to fun. Walk its scenic waterfront and narrow alleys; explore an 18th century Taoist temple and bustling street market; and relax on a laid-back beach.

Chinese New Year celebrations, quirky local festivals, wine and culinary events — Hong Kong has a year-round calendar of festivals that blend tradition and modernity, East and West. These tours are an invitation to cruise visitors to join the party.











■ CELEBRATING THE GODDESS OF THE SEA ■



The 23rd day of the 3rd lunar month*.

Tin Hau, Goddess of the Sea, is revered by fishermen and anyone whose life and destiny is tied to the sea. Hong Kong's fishing and maritime heritage means the goddess has a strong following here. Join the locals as they celebrate her festival in her temples and with colourful floral wreaths.



■ THE QUIRKY FESTIVAL OF AN ISLAND COMMUNITY

The 5th to the 9th days of the 4th lunar month.

Every year, the people of Cheung Chau prepare for the thousands of people that descend upon their tiny island for what Time.com deemed one of the world's Top 10 Quirky Local Festivals — the Cheung Chau Bun Festival. Get a ringside seat for the exuberant parade of 'floating colours' that is the highlight of these unique celebrations.

■ BUDDHIST RITUALS AND CEREMONIES ●



The 8th day of the 4th lunar month.

Witness Hong Kong Buddhists bathing statues of Buddha and performing other rituals and ceremonies to celebrate his birthday at the beautiful Po Lin Monastery, nestled in the scenic hills of Ngong Ping on Lantau Island.

■ SPECTACULAR DRAGON BOAT CARNIVAL ●



Early summer

Soak in the holiday atmosphere as Hong Kong commemorates an ancient Chinese hero with elaborately decorated dragon boats, racing to the beat of drums and cheered on by crowds of festive spectators with beer, live music and carnival fun down by the harbour.











■ FULL MOON OVER ASIA'S WORLD CITY •

One week during the 8th lunar month

The ancient Chinese Mid-Autumn Festival is given a modern treatment in Hong Kong, where glowing lanterns merge with the city's trademark neon and fiery dragons dance through the busy streets of a festive metropolis. Enjoy this enchanting festival by moon-gazing from the deck of a Victoria Harbour cruise.

A CELEBRATION OF WINING AND DINING

1-30 November

November in Hong Kong is an epicurean feast of the finer things in life, including wines from around the world paired with the creations of the city's culinary wizards. Attend the world-renowned Hong Kong Wine & Dine Festival, dine at the track, visit a historic wine cellar, eat award-winning dishes... but whatever you do, dig in!


■ New Year Countdown Cruise

SHORT & SWEET EXCURSIONS

From modern architecture to ancient martial arts, Hong Kong has enough cultural attractions to keep one busy for weeks. But cruise visitors often have limited time. That's what makes these 'bite-sized' tours of 1-3 hours each ideal for people who want to get the most from short stays.







■ BAKING CHINESE CAKES •

Hong Kong is a city that loves to eat and celebrate, so it's no surprise that it is big into cakes, with local specialities being mooncakes and wife cakes. Take a new skill home with you after chefs from one of the city's oldest and best-loved bakeries show you how to make some Chinese-style pastries.



WALKING IN MODERN ARCHITECTURE

If Hong Kong is a giant museum of the best in contemporary architecture, Central is where the showpiece exhibits are kept. Prepare to spend a few hours looking upwards as an architectural expert guides you around this district of towering skyscrapers.





■ CHINESE TEA APPRECIATION

A Chinese tea cup may look small, but it holds a great deal more than just tea and water. Every sip contains the distillation of thousands of years of Chinese culture. Let the experts take you on a journey into the exquisite tastes and intricate rituals of Chinese tea culture.

■ EXPLORING CANTONESE OPERA •



Recognised as an intangible part of humanity's culture by UNESCO, Cantonese opera is an exotic world of symbolic gestures, elaborate costumes, impressive martial arts and historical figures and stories. Unveil the hidden meanings of this ancient art form with classes, demonstrations and by meeting the performers.





■ KUNG FU FIGHTING!

No visit to the hometown of Bruce Lee would be complete without seeing some martial arts. In the open air in Kowloon Park, watch a colourful variety of traditional kung fu demonstrations and cultural performances, such as ceremonial drumming, lion dances and dragon dances. And then try out some moves yourself!

■ SAIL IN A CHINESE JUNK •

Board the last authentic Chinese junk in Hong Kong and set sail into the city's beautiful harbour. Originally owned and manned by Chinese fishermen, the *Duk Ling* is typical of the junks that crisscrossed the waters of Hong Kong for hundreds of years.

TAI CHI CLASS

The graceful movements of tai chi balance the body's internal yin and yang, doing as much for the mind and soul as for the body. To this day, the ancient movements of this martial art are practised in Hong Kong to relieve stress and improve health. Try it for yourself under the guidance of experts and in the open space in front of the Hong Kong Museum of Art!





■ THE HONG KONG STORY



From Hong Kong's earliest life some 400 million years ago to its return to Chinese sovereignty in 1997, 'The Hong Kong Story' exhibition at the Hong Kong Museum of History showcases how this modern miracle came to be. Multimedia technology and guides help you get the most from this journey through history.

Hong Kong is packed with events year-round, from Chinese celebrations in the spring to outdoor occasions in the summer, fine food in the autumn and a world-class fireworks display at the end of the year.

■ CULTURAL CELEBRATIONS

Kick off the summer with four different Chinese festivals. Catch lion dances during Cheung Chau's Bun Festival, see the Big Buddha on his birthday, and visit temples during the Tin Hau and Tam Kung festivals.



■ SPORTING EXTRAVAGANZAS

Watch the Hong Kong Sevens during April, and check out more thrilling sports events throughout the year.



■ DRAGON BOAT CARNIVAL

Watch the world's finest dragon boating athletes row it out during the Dragon Boat Carnival, and then join in on beer-filled celebrations as the crowds gather by the harbour.

Catch Pulse, a stunning 3D light show themed according to and coinciding with special times of the year, and watch as the city lights up at night.
