

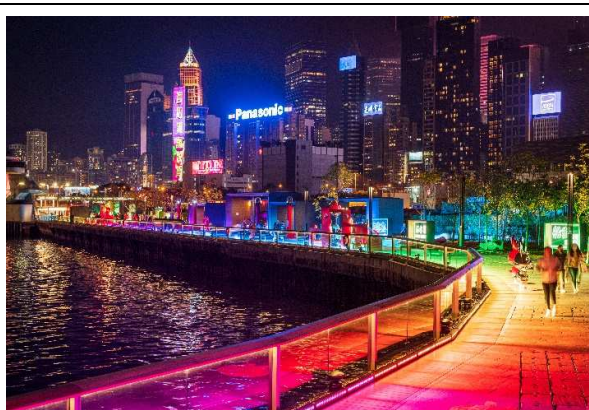

**Interactive installations connecting the Island and Kowloon Coasts

1. Fantastic Sea of Flowers at Tamar Park (Tamar Park, Admiralty)

- A fantastic sea of flowers on harbour front with 200 colossal LED-lit flowers with special lighting effects.
- Together with decorations such as ribbons and New Year symbols and the green carpet of grasses of the Park, the sea of flowers marks the coming of a warm and festive Spring with the blooms
- Wave at the three interactive installations to reveal unique light effects
- **Interactive time: 10 am – 10 pm**



2. Rainbow Walk (Wan Chai Temporary Promenade, Wan Chai)

- A 200-metre Rainbow Walk along Wan Chai waterfront
- Three colour changing photo-spots with Victoria Harbour skyline from different perspectives
- A series of festive patterns such as treasure coins and flowers will pop out on the ground immersively as pedestrians pass the walkway, sending out blessings for the New Year of Rabbit
- **Interactive time: 10 am – 10 pm**



3. A Bright New Year at Tsim Sha Tsui Promenade (Hong Kong Cultural Centre Viewing Deck, Tsim Sha Tsui)

- A herd of lively bunnies hop onto the Viewing Deck of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre and take selfies with visitors in front of the 180-degree harbour view
- As the night grows, the viewing deck will glow to life with glimmering light effects accompanied by celebratory music
- **Interactive time: 10 am – 11 pm**



4. A Giant Rabbit at Central Pier (Central Pier, Central)


- First-ever rooftop decoration for Star Ferry Pier, sending the public blessings for Chinese New Year
- Passengers travelling from Tsim Sha Tsui to Central will be warmly greeted by the cute Lucky Rabbit as they approach the pier



5. A Symphony of Lights with time-limited light and laser effects

The multimedia show A Symphony of Lights, staged at 8pm daily, is featuring time-limited light and laser effects until Lantern Festival (5 February). Together with upbeat musics, the multimedia display continues to brighten up the Harbour and demonstrate Hong Kong’s appeal as “Asia’s World City”.
