


## CrescentRating Customer Experience Map for Hotel Touchpoints

## **Implementation Matrix**













O' mankind, eat of that which is Halal (lawful) and Tayyib (good & pure) on the earth ........... (al-Quran 2:168)

All food are Halal except those ordained as non-halal (Haram or Forbidden in Islam).

- Livestock, Seafood, Birds (except birds of prey and carrion eating), Plant-based
- Non-Halal foods includes those containing pork, alcohol, blood, dead animals, carnivores, reptiles, rodents, Insects, Mules/Donkeys
- Animals should be slaughtered accordingly to the Islamic requirements (Zabihah).







## **Operational**

- Food ingredients cannot contain nonhalal sources
  - Adhere to regulated labelling and highlighting
- No food cross-contamination
  - Adopt proper food storage, transportation and preparation
  - Halal and Non-Halal utensils, crockery and cutlery.







## Ingredient - Alcohol

"They ask you (O Muhammad) concerning alcoholic drink and gambling. Say: 'In them is a great sin, and (some) benefits for men, but the sin of them is greater than their benefit.'" - Quran, Chapter 2:219

- Alcohol consumption is prohibited
- "Most Muslims surveyed say that drinking alcohol is morally wrong. More than half in all countries surveyed hold this view, including more than ninein-ten in Thailand (98%), Ghana (93%), Malaysia (93%), the Palestinian territories (92%), Indonesia (91%), Nigeria (91%) and Pakistan (91%)"







## **Gradual Implementation: Halal Food**

#### Phase 1

- Create a curated list of nearby Halal restaurants, including delivery options (Hotels)
- Clearly mark the food at buffets (Hotels)
- Encourage convenient store(s) to have a ready to eat Halal food shelf with clear signage (Malls, Attractions & MICE Venues)

#### Phase 2

- Introduce a selection of pre-packaged Halal snacks/beverages or partner a nearby Halal restaurant for room service (Hotels)
- Introduce a Halal breakfast corner (Hotels)
- On board strictly vegetarian outlets (Malls & Attractions)
- On board a fast food chain already Halal certified (Malls & Attractions)
- Prioritize selecting Halal caterers for events or the ability to accommodate Halal dietary restrictions (MICE Venues)

#### Phase 3

 Setup a dedicated Halal certified kitchen with a wider range of options (Hotels)




## **Basics of Daily Prayers** & Friday Prayers

- 5 times a day
- Travelers: possible to reduce to 3 times
- Place: Any "clean" place
- Direction: Facing Mecca (Qibla)
- Washing (ablution) before prayers








## **Prayer Times & Friday Prayers**

- Less than 10 to 15 minutes to perform ablution and complete a prayer session.
- **Friday congregational prayers** is compulsory for males. Not compulsory if your are a traveler.
- Prayer times based on the location & date


- It is preferred that all prayers are done as soon as the prayer is due
- Some will not use the concession to combine even when traveling



### **Qibla Direction**

• The Qibla is the direction that Muslims face during prayer (Salah).

 It points towards the Kaaba, the sacred cube-shaped building located in Makkah (Mecca).









### **Water for Ablution**

- Required to go through a washing procedure before prayers
- Includes washing hands, face, arms, ears, etc.
- And the FEET



Currently most washrooms in public places do not have a "foot wash" place





## **Gradual Implementation: Prayer Rooms**

#### Phase 1

- Mark the prayer direction in the rooms of one floor (Hotels)
- Identify a clean & quiet space to be designated as a prayer space (Malls, Attractions & MICE Venues)
- Provide basic necessities (prayer rugs & Qibla indicator) (Malls, Attractions & MICE Venues)

#### Phase 2

- Consider installing a dedicated ablution station to perform ablution. (Malls, Attractions & MICE Venues)
- Display clear signage to indicate location of the prayer room and washrooms with ablution facilities.
   (Malls, Attractions & MICE Venues)

#### Phase 3

- Mark the prayer direction in all the rooms (Hotels)
- If space allows, create separate prayer rooms for males and females. If not, use a separator. (Malls, Attractions & MICE Venues)



## **Water Usage & Toilets**

- 1. Water usage after the use of toilet
- Water usage for ablution (wudu) ritual washing before prayers



## **Water Usage in Toilets**

- Availability of Facilities: In many Muslimmajority countries and regions, toilets are equipped with facilities such as a bidet, a handheld bidet shower, or a small jug of water (known as a lota) specifically for this purpose.
- Accommodation in Non-Muslim Majority
   Countries: In countries where Muslims are a
   minority, finding suitable facilities for water based cleansing can be challenging.





## **Gradual Implementation**

#### Phase 1

- Provide a portable bidet as a temporary alternative for the dedicated taps/bidet/shower head
- Indicate (through signage, flyer, etc.) within the premise that this particular washroom has bidet (Attractions, Shopping malls, and MICE venues)

#### Phase 2

- Within the existing bathroom, add an additional facility for ablution
  - Water bidet or shower head inside one of the toilet stalls

#### Phase 3

- Install "Japanese Toilet" in a toilet in the hotel room (Hotels)
- Install "Japanese Toilet" in a toilet near the prayer room.
   (Attractions, Shopping malls, and MICE venues)

### **Water for Ablution**

- Required to go through a washing procedure before prayers

- And the FEET

## **Gradual Implementation**

#### Phase 1

#### Phase 2

- Within the existing washrooms, add an additional facility for ablution
  - A small faucet next to the sink positioned at waist height

#### Phase 3

 Add a dedicated ablution space within the premise, located near or next to the prayer room (Attractions, Shopping malls, and MICE venues)





## Fasting in the month of Ramadan

- Compulsory fasting during the whole month of Ramadan.
- Ramadan is **9th month** of the Islamic Lunar Calendar.
- Children are not required to fast.
- The sick, menstruating women and travelers are not required to fast. But will have to make up the when the condition becomes normal.
