Tourism Overview 2024 Chairman's Opening Remarks

The city's dynamic character is further enriched by its resident expatriate community, global culinary offerings, a vibrant arts and entertainment scene, accessible countryside, and unique movie culture that draws global travellers to our iconic landmarks.

Under our "One Country, Two Systems", Hong Kong has the distinctive and unique advantage of enjoying strong support of the Motherland and being closely connected to the entire world. The Hong

Kong Tourism Board is working to further broaden our tourism appeal, positioning our city as the quintessential "Events Capital of Asia," an unmatched "World's Meeting Place," and the strategic "Cruise Hub of Asia," thereby strengthening and elevating our status as one of the most international cities in the world.

(2) Strengthen our Role as a Tourism Hub

As the international gateway to the Greater Bay Area (GBA), Hong Kong is a super-connector that brings China and the global business community closer together. The 14th National Five-Year Plan fosters Hong Kong's growth in eight strategic sectors, including finance, technology, cultural exchange, trade, shipping, aviation, legal services, and intellectual property. Hong Kong's exceptional transport infrastructure and connectivity provides seamless access within five hours by air, sea and land to locations where half of the world's population resides. The opening of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge and our national high-speed railway terminus, has taken Hong Kong's connectivity to new heights. With such world-class infrastructure in place, Hong Kong is not only a travel destination, but also a tourism hub that attracts visitors to travel via Hong Kong into and out of the Mainland and neighbouring Asian countries or regions.

(3) Advance Toward a Paradigm of High-Caliber Growth

By providing visitors with exceptional experiences, the Hong Kong Tourism Board aims to target new and emerging markets and segments, including Muslim and Middle Eastern markets, continuing to pursue high-quality growth, and reinforcing the competitiveness and sustainable development of Hong Kong tourism while expanding its contribution to society and the economy.
